French engine firm continues to operate under strict safety rules



Nanni has enforced strict safety measures at its French HQ

French engine manufacturer Nanni has released a statement to say that most of its staff have been ‘teleworking’ since March 17, when France officially entered lockdown, including the company’s spare parts, aftersales, commercial, R&D and administrative departments.

At the company’s headquarters in La Teste de Buch in southwestern France, production lines, parts, receiving and sending, and sales administration have been maintained but with a

reduced workforce in respect of the recommended safety guidelines. Personal protection equipment has been dispensed and new strict rules have been applied for all staff present on site.

With the entire workforce still mobilised and connected, Nanni says it is ensuring the production, supply and the aftersales of engines and spare parts all over the world, especially for its professional customers (ie, safety at sea, fishermen, army and offshore platforms etc).

“Now is the time for change,” says Nanni president and CEO Amalia Festa. “Together we will be able to accomplish great and beautiful things. The solidarity and the motivation of our staff, as well as the power of our international and French network, will allow Nanni to emerge stronger and to continue in the coming years.”
